 AT THIS TIME as we respond with a collective "CHEERS!", "CONGRATULATIONS!", "MAZEL TOV!"


Virtual Event Etiquette:

- **Event Attire:** Business Casual, no tie or jacket required. Remember, parts of this event are interactive, and **YOU WILL BE SEEN.**
- <u>Don't do anything in front of the computer screen that you wouldn't do at a cocktail party</u>. For example:

Zoom Information

The Technology is Easy:

• Interactive Program: While this program is interactive, you will be muted except for the parts where we will allow you to use your microphone, during the social receptions and at the end for The Toast. During these times, you can enable your microphone by clicking on the Mic Icon, either unmuting or muting.



• Utilize the Chat Feature: While you will be muted, you can still "chat" by typing a congratulatory message to Steve by clicking on the "chat" function at the bottom of your screen. We encourage you to do so! This will be printed for Steve to see after the program. JUST REMEMBER THAT EVERYONE WILL SEE WHAT YOU WRITE, SO KEEP IT APPROPRIATE. Just click the "chat" icon and start typing....



• **We want to see each other!** We encourage you to enable your camera by clicking on the camera icon so we can see you! That's the whole point – for us to see and interact with each other, and for Steve to enjoy seeing all those who attend to help honor him. Please remove the red line over your camera icon by clicking on it – now the camera is rolling!



• Who's in the room? Part of the fun for Steve and all of us is to see who is in the room. While we will set the view on "Speaker View" to optimize your experience, we encourage you to scroll through the screens to see everyone. You can scroll easily by clicking on the icon at the top right corner of the screen-enabling you to toggle from "Speaker View" to "Gallery View".
