CRITERIA AND SELECTION PROCESS

What are the criteria?

Simon Lazarus, Jr., Human Relations Award nominees exhibit integrity, reliability, creativity, and compassion in everyday activities, and who, in a group or individually, volunteer to:

- Help individuals and groups, especially during the worldwide pandemic
- Lead others to tackle society's problems
- Act to reduce prejudice, hate, intolerance

Students' Community Service efforts demonstrate:

- Sincerity
- Dependability
- Resourcefulness
- Impact

In 2020, we experienced unprecedented challenges and unique opportunities. Examples of what prospective nominees might have accomplished before or during this extraordinary year include, but are not limited to:

- Ran programs to benefit first responders, front line workers, military and/or their families
- Tutored students learning virtually
- Assisted families facing childcare, medical or food insecurities
- Eased the loneliness of isolated elderly
- Led holiday food drives
- Promoted understanding between other faiths, races, and cultures
- Combated racial injustice
- Spoke out on behalf of the homeless
- Worked with immigrants and their families
- Helped empower communities to register and vote in 2020 elections
- Raised funds for worthy causes

What is the selection process?

Nominees are assigned a confidential number and then screened anonymously. AJC volunteers select ten junior and ten senior semi-finalists. A panel of distinguished community leaders serving as judges then chooses a winner and four finalists from each class.

What are the prizes?

All nominees will receive a book and a certificate recognizing their accomplishment. Each school library will get the same book with a bookplate inscribed with the name(s) of its nominee(s). The winner and four finalists from each class will be awarded a cash prize. (\$750 for each winner; \$350 for each finalist)
