How Media Outlets Can Address Rising Antisemitism

All media outlets can implement measures to better understand, respond to, and prevent anti-Jewish hatred in our society. AJC's Call to Action Against Antisemitism: A Society-Wide Nonpartisan Guide for America calls on media outlets to take the following steps:

Media outlets should train reporters to recognize antisemitism in all its forms
The media should continuously engage with the Jewish community: local Jewish federations, leaders of local synagogues, and AJC regional offices can provide local and expert perspectives, on and off the record
