To effectively fight antisemitism, we must first be able to clearly define it."

Congressional Gold Medal Awarded to Ben Ferencz— Last Surviving Nuremberg Prosecutor

AJC Palm Beach paid tribute to Benjamin Ferencz, the last surviving prosecutor from the Nuremberg trials, who was awarded the Congressional Gold Medal at a ceremony in Delray Beach. We extend our gratitude to Congresswoman Lois Frankel for introducing the Benjamin Ferencz Congressional Gold Medal Act, which authorized the award.

American Jewish Committee (AJC) advocated diligently for its bipartisan support. Lisa Beers, President of AJC Palm Beach, delivered remarks praising the incredible life and legacy of Ben Ferencz. At age 27, Ben was appointed Chief Prosecutor in the Einsatzgruppen Trial—a trial the Associated Press called "the biggest murder trial in history." All 22 defendants were convicted. They were responsible for the murder of more than one million Jews.
