What is your understanding of the makeup with the West Bank? What conditions should the Palestinians and Israelis accept as a solidified border?

How would you craft a peace process today? Do you envision a one-state, two-state, confederation, or perhaps an entirely different approach? Which additional stakeholders, beyond Israelis and Palestinians, should be engaged? What does your vision of an optimal resolution entail?
